### From the Music Director & Conductor

### -Susan Davenny Wyner-

Who would imagine that Gaetano Donizetti, the most Italian of composers, would be drawn to a romantic tragedy set in the far north reaches of Scotland? But Scottish history with its violent wars and feuds fascinated 19th century readers and audiences. Donizetti was no exception. In 1835 he created his most famous of all bel canto operas, *Lucia di Lammermoor*, which is loosely based upon Sir Walter Scott's historical novel, *The Bride of Lammermoor*.

The story is of a sensitive star-crossed heroine caught in a feud between her own family and that of her chosen beloved. She and her brother Henry (Enrico) are the last of a disgraced clan of royalists. They inhabit a lonely castle overlooked by an enemy Jacobite. Henry is desperate to reclaim his status by arranging a marriage between Lucia and a scion of an influential Edinburgh clan. Lucia, though, has fallen in love with Edward (Edgardo) the enemy Jacobite. And she braves political and familial danger to meet him in secret. The outcome is heartbreaking. Lucia is driven beyond reason as her brother, her lover, and a priest, all deny her love and any control over her own destiny.

What is extraordinary is how Donizetti brings the story to life. From the very opening —with its rich brooding menace and ominous mood—we are drawn into a sense of isolation, loneliness, oppression. We hear the dark power of men's voices. When Lucia enters, her high voice entrances. She inhabits a bright world of sunlight and fantasy—suggesting a songbird struggling to fly free, to soar with the winds high above the confining walls of the castle. But Donizetti has created no simple songbird. We soon learn that she is not only sensitive and imaginative but is also passionate, feisty, and emotionally complex.

Donizetti's other characters are never cardboard figures. We feel for Edward—who is far from a conventional, heroic lover. Though enraptured by Lucy's warmth and sensitivity, even he is caught up in the violence of his own family history. We feel for her brother Henry's emotional needs: his love for his sister, his obsessive, visceral hatred of his rival Edward, his violent need for revenge that blocks out her pleas for love. All are caught in an unrelenting, inevitable force of past actions that spiral into Lucia's mad killing of her enforced bridegroom on their wedding night.

Lucia's "Mad Scene" is the most famous of the opera. How different it is to hear it in context. As Lucia enters before the terrified guests of the wedding banquet, she imagines Edgardo calling her to join him. Edgardo's voice is given to a solo flute that tenderly twines itself around her and recalls music we've heard earlier in their duet. We feel her 'madness' as an emotional release from a controlling, coldly rational world, a release of passion both terrifying and ecstatic. And it is only now that all realize they share responsibility for pushing her beyond sanity. The repercussions are profound. Edgardo feels it

most of all, and commits an equally desperately mad act—suicide— to attempt to atone and join her in eternity.

In the end, the potency of its dramatic arc and the revelations of such rich, passionate, emotional depths of character, are what make *Lucia* such a masterpiece. Yes—we can be transfixed by heavenly love duets and vocal fireworks—but so much more is going on. Donizetti paved the way for the romantic operas, particularly of Verdi and Puccini, to come.

It has been a joy to explore the dimensions of this work with Austin, our extraordinary cast of singing actors/actor singers, and our orchestral 'voices'.

## From the Production Director & Scenic Designer -David Vosburgh-

How I approached the "Lucia" set designs

There are three areas of concern as you approach the designs for a stage production. What is needed for the action/staging. What aesthetic values do you want to incorporate. What are the practical considerations, such as what are the limitations of the stage on which it is being performed, how much time and crew you have to create the sets, and what the budget is for them.

In the case of "Lucia" there are four locations indicated in the score. Enrico's study, a portion of the castle grounds including a "haunted" fountain, the castle's Great Hall, and the graveyard of Edgardo's ancestors. Many times these scenes include only 2-4 singers, but the two exteriors should suggest a large open space, Enrico's study never has more than three characters at one time, while the Great Hall must accommodate a chorus of 28, all seven principal singers and a small dance troupe.

Once you have an understanding of the requirements of these spaces you can begin to investigate the historical period, the style of architecture, the emotional mood of the scenes and the characters." Lucia" is based on a novel by Sir Walter Scott that was inspired by an actual historical event. The place is an old castle in a remote part of Scotland in the late 1600s. I felt that the exterior scenes were the only places Lucia and Edgardo were in control of their actions and emotions. The interiors should give the impression that Lucia was a prisoner in her own home and had no control over what happened to her there. The castle has been usurped by Enrico and Lucia's family from Edgardo's family, at the cost of Edgardo's father's life, and they are now rather impoverished. The castle should seem old and sparsely furnished as if many things had been sold off.

The practical considerations include a stage that is really an architectural orchestra sound shell. All scenic elements must remain onstage and out of sight until needed. Luckily Stambaugh's stage is very wide and deep and offstage spaces can be created by closing in the proscenium opening with a pair of

downstage towers containing the major entrances, and with curtains and a sky drop that also can be used to conceal scenic units mounted on wheeled platforms called wagons. Fortunately we have accumulated a good stock of flats, platforms, steps and columns, etc., over the past 14 years. We have also received donations of furniture, chandeliers, and misc. scenic pieces from

Carousel Dinner Theater, Cleveland Opera, The Youngstown Country Club, Powers Auditorium and Stambaugh Auditorium as well as what we have built, borrowed or scavenged. My master Carpenter, Frank Bongen, and a constantly changing crew of 2-4 YSU students are able to create the sets on a part time basis in a capacious and convenient warehouse space provided by the Gasser Chair Company.

All design decisions are made in collaboration with the costumer, Barbara Luce, the lighting designer, Dani Dier, and of course, the director, Austin Pendleton. Theater, whether musical or opera, is the most collaborative of the performing arts which make for an exciting exchange of ideas and some truly amazing experience for our audiences.



### Music Director & Conductor



Susan Davenny Wyner has received international acclaim for her conducting. The Library of Congress featured her in its 2003 "Women Who Dare" Engagement Calendar, and the MacNeil-Lehrer Newshour and WGBH Television have presented documentary features on her life and work. Her conducting credits include the Czech Philharmonic Chamber Orchestra, Odense Danish Symphony, Los Angeles Philharmonic, Boston Lyric Opera, Cleveland Orchestra members in benefit concerts, concerts at the Hollywood Bowl, and recordings for Bridge and Albany Records. André Previn, Lynn Harrell, Claude Frank, Peter Serkin, and Emanuel Ax, have been among

her guest soloists.

She has conducted repertoire from the 15th through 21st century, working with period instruments as well as premiering over 40 new works. *The New York Times* called her conducting "Rapturous, richly textured and emotionally compelling." *Opera News Online* praised the "Terrific lyrical moments under Susan Davenny Wyner's deft baton," *The Los Angeles Times* praised her "Sensitive and thoughtful leadership," *The Boston Globe* wrote, "Under her baton the music breathes, lilts, romps, sighs, and sparkles," and four times selected her conducted performances among the "Best Musical Events of the Year"


She has been Music Director and Conductor of Boston Midsummer Opera since 2007, the Warren Philharmonic Orchestra since 1999, and Opera Western Reserve since its creation in 2004. From 1999-2005, she was Music Director and Conductor of The New England String Ensemble in Boston, which she brought to national prominence.

Initially trained as a violinist and violist, Susan Davenny Wyner went on to an international career as a Lyric Soprano – singing with the Metropolitan Opera, New York City Opera, London Symphony, Cleveland Orchestra, Boston Symphony, and other major orchestras. She often premiered works written especially for her and recorded for Columbia Masterworks, Angel/EMI, Naxos, New World, CRI and Musical Heritage, winning both a Grammy and a Grand Prix du Disc. After a hit and run accident destroyed her singing voice, she began her career as a conductor.

She has held conducting positions at New England Conservatory, the Cleveland Institute of Music, Wellesley College, Brandeis and Cornell Universities, and has conducted numerous lecture demonstrations and master-classes for the National Conductors Guild, the Shanghai Conservatory, and Harvard and Yale Universities among many others. Susan Davenny Wyner graduated *summa cum laude* from Cornell University with degrees in both comparative literature and music, then continued her studies at Yale and Columbia

Universities, at the Tanglewood and Aspen Music Festivals, and at the Los Angeles Philharmonic Institute. In 1998, The American Orchestra League named her a Catherine Filene Shouse Conductor – a first-time award given by a national panel of conductors and orchestral managers to a conductor poised for major career.

### Director Scenic Designer



David Vosburgh has taught at New York University, The New York Academy of Theatrical Arts, The American Musical and Dramatic Academy, Austin Peay University and Youngstown State. He has directed and/or designed over 100 productions for opera companies, summer stock, and national tours. He has performed more that 30 operatic roles including creating the role of Tiny Duffy in the Houston Grand Opera premiere of Carlisle Floyd's Willy Stark which was shown on PBS-TV's Great Performances. He was in the original Broadway productions of Maggie Flynn, 1776, A Little Night Music, Evita and A Doll's Life and in the revivals

or national companies of *Sweeny Todd, Take Me Along, Cabaret, Guys and Dolls* and *Parade*. Locally, he has been seen in *Brigadoon* and *Big River* at Porthouse Theater and *Jekyll and Hyde, Carousel* and The *Sound of Music* at Carousel Dinner Theater. He has served as Assistant Artistic Director for the New York Lyric Opera Company and the Youngstown Playhouse and has been the Production Director for Opera Western Reserve since its creation in 2004.



performed many operatic concerts and recitals.


#### **Guest Director:**



### Jynopsis

#### PART I, SCENE 1

Scotland, 17th century. An intruder has been spotted at night on the grounds of Lammermoor Castle, home of Enrico Ashton. Normanno, the captain of the guard, sends Enrico's men off in search of the stranger. Enrico is troubled; his family's fortunes are in danger and only the arranged marriage of his sister, Lucia, with Lord Arturo can save them. The chaplain Raimondo, Lucia's tutor, reminds Enrico that the girl is still mourning the death of her mother. But Normanno reveals that Lucia is concealing a great love for Edgardo di Ravenswood, leader of the Ashtons' political enemies. Enrico is furious and swears vengeance.

#### SCENE 2

Just before dawn at a fountain in the woods nearby, Lucia and her companion Alisa are waiting for Edgardo. Lucia relates that, at the fountain, she has seen the ghost of a girl who was stabbed by her jealous lover. Alisa urges her to leave Edgardo, but Lucia insists that her love for Edgardo brings her great joy and may overcome all. Edgardo arrives and explains that he must go to France on a political mission. Before he leaves he wants to make peace with Enrico. Lucia, however, asks Edgardo to keep their love a secret. Edgardo agrees, and they exchange rings and vows of devotion.

#### SCENE 3

It is some months later, the day on which Lucia is about to be forced to marry Arturo Bucklaw. Normanno assures Enrico that he has successfully intercepted all correspondence between the lovers and has in addition procured a forged letter, supposedly from Edgardo, that indicates he is involved with another woman. As the captain goes off to welcome the groom, Lucia enters, continuing to defy her brother. Enrico shows her the forged letter. Lucia is heartbroken, but Enrico insists that she marry Arturo to save the family and fortune.

#### **SCENE 4**

As the wedding guests arrive, Enrico explains to Arturo that Lucia is still in a state of melancholy because of her mother's death. The girl enters and reluctantly signs the marriage contract. Suddenly Edgardo bursts in, claiming his bride, and the entire company is overcome by shock (Sextet: "Chi mi frena in tal momento"). Arturo and Enrico order Edgardo to leave but he insists that he and Lucia are engaged. When Raimondo shows him the contract with Lucia's signature, Edgardo curses her and tears his ring from her finger before finally leaving in despair and rage.

#### PART II, SCENE 1

Raimondo interrupts the wedding festivities with the news that Lucia has gone mad and killed Arturo. Lucia enters, covered in blood. Moving between tenderness, joy, and terror, she recalls her meetings with Edgardo and imagines she is with him on their wedding night. She vows she will never be happy in heaven without her lover and that she will see him there. When Enrico returns, he is enraged at Lucia's behavior, but soon realizes that she has lost her senses. After a confused and violent exchange with her brother, Lucia collapses.

#### SCENE 2

After a stormy night, at the graveyard of his ancestors, Edgardo laments that he has to live without Lucia and awaits a duel with Enrico, which he hopes will end his own life. Guests coming from Lammermoor Castle tell him that the dying Lucia has called his name. As he is about to rush to her, Raimondo announces that she has died. Determined to join Lucia in heaven, Edgardo stabs himself to death


